# European Road Safety Charter

During the last ten years, the number of deaths on European roads has been cut by almost 45%. However, there is still a long way to go. Every day, 85 people die in road traffic accidents.

The European Road Safety Charter has been consolidated since 2004 as **the** largest civil society platform on Road Safety.

As a European Commission led initiative, the ERSCharter plays a significant role in the pan-European effort to make our roads safer. The charter is a community which today includes over **2,300 signatories** contributing to the improvement of road safety standards and culture by making **real commitments** and undertaking **concrete actions**.

Our vast community of members demonstrates the genuine support and commitment for road safety in Europe. Organisations, industries, businesses and institutions take initiatives targeted at their members, employees and the rest of civil society.

# A new ERSCharter mission in 2013-2016

The new ERSCharter aims to promote the commitment of civil society, with a focus on vulnerable users, especially youth. Its mission is built upon community: the need for stakeholders and members of civil society to **join forces** and take a common responsibility for road safety.

To encourage and support European associations, schools, universities, companies of all types and sizes, and local authorities to take actions for road safety in Europe.

To acknowledge all contributions by civil society to road safety.

## Knowledge

To facilitate civil society members in acquiring and sharing knowledge on road safety issues in the European Union.

To promote effective dialogue for the transfer of road safety experiences and practices at all levels of governance in the European Union.
