2022 was a challenging yet exciting year for our services as we worked to meet post-COVID demand. Learnings from the challenges experienced during COVID-19 redefined how we deliver our educational programmes going forward where a blended approach offering, with either in-person or virtual appointments continue to be available and both with their own merits.

During 2022, our Nationwide Road Safety Education Service delivered road safety education to over 127,000 people throughout the country.

Road safety presentations were delivered by our team of Road Safety Promotion Officers to schools, companies, pre-schools, youthreach centers as well as community groups throughout the year.

Our <u>StreetSmart service</u>, which is the RSA's interactive primary school resource was highly sought after where road safety is brought to life in a fun way for young children using a 'Streetscape' mat and props which incorporate typical street scenes.

The <u>Road Safety Interactive Unit 'Shuttle'</u> continued to offer a fully interactive road safety educational experiences using simulated virtual situations.

The invaluable 'Check it Fits' service conducted 4,468 child car seat checks in 2022. Virtual and in-person appointments are available nationwide and this service is free of charge!

Other exciting Road Safety innovations continue to be as popular as ever and include road safety games, our VR Oculus experience, a test of your car maintenance knowledge as well as our <u>3D Learning Portal</u>. Further details on these can be found later in this newsletter.

The 5th Government Road Safety <u>Strategy</u> which was launched in 2021 defines our road safety priorities for the next decade. Guiding this Strategy is Vision Zero, Ireland's long-term goal of achieving zero road deaths or serious injuries by 2050. Different sectors continue to work together using a range of safety performance targets to achieve this vision and road safety education will continue to play an important role in contributing to this success.

Mary Ward was an Irish scientist and scholar who, in 1869 in Birr Co. Offaly, became the first person in the world to be killed in a car crash.

Beep Beep Day

This is a national road safety awareness day for young children. It takes place in crèches and Montessori schools around the country during Road Safety Week from 2 - 8 October but can also take place at any other time during the year.

On Beep Beep Day, children aged 5 and under will practise basic road safety skills with the Simon and Friends road safety storybooks, songs, games and activities.

We will distribute Beep Beep Day packs to participating pre-schools free of charge. You can order your pack from www.rsa.ie while stocks last.



CYCLE RIGHT is the national standard for cycle training and provides practical cycle safety and skills training to promote competent and confident cyclists. The programme is produced and supported by the Department of Transport, Tourism and Sport, the Road Safety Authority and Cycling Ireland, with input from central and local agencies and other groups.

CYCLE RIGHT is delivered over three stages with participants gaining skills and knowledge on a phased basis which prepares the individual to cycle in increasingly complex road scenarios. Ideally, individual sessions in each stage should be delivered at intervals (weekly) to allow sufficient time for practice in between.

Cycle Right Parent and Guardian

E-learning which was launched in 2023 will increase your knowledge on cycling with children and supporting them to become safe cyclists:

Topics covered include: Preparing to go cycling – clothing, helmet, bike and conditions checks; Teaching a child to cycle - from the first time on a bike through balance and pedaling to independent cycling; Features of the road environment – situations to be conscious of and how to guide children through them; Turning left and right - the steps to outline to a child in making these essential maneuvers on a bike; Cycling with a child - what position should you, as an adult, take and how can you support a child cycling on the road.

For 1st Class Children

Seatbelt Sheriff is aimed at children in 1st class. The children become Seatbelt Sheriffs by taking a pledge to always wear their safety belt and to make sure that everyone else in the car is buckled up. They are given a certificate, which gives them the power to instruct passengers and drivers to 'Buckle Up' in any vehicle in which they are travelling.




Learning Portal – A 3D road safety adventure!

Road Safety Matters

For 12-16-year olds

Road Safety Matters is a teacher-led road safety resource for Junior Cycle students that is interesting, fun and enjoyable for teachers and the students. The resource has been developed to place student wellbeing at the centre of learning. The resource aims to ensure students learn the knowledge, skills and attitudes necessary to keep themselves and others safe on the roads. The lesson plans are available through the Virtual Learning Environment and many different teachings and learning methodologies are used.

The learning experienced while taking part in this programme will be of use to students in their everyday lives as pedestrians, cyclists, passengers or drivers. It will enhance students' wellbeing throughout their lives and empower students with the necessary skills to be responsible, safe road users.

The programme consists of four strands:

Strand 1 - Who's who in road safety?

Strand 2 - Are we roadworthy?

Strand 3 - Recognising road risk

Strand 4 - Socially responsible road use

Virtual interactive presentations now available

Students will learn:

- About the consequences of risky behaviour
- How to make informed decisions about their own and others welfare
- To become aware of their personal values towards road safety
- How their values affect their behaviours and moral choices
- Of the threats that exist to their personal safety
- How to take steps to protect themselves and to value being healthy and safe
- That they have rights and responsibilities as a road user

Transition Year

Your Road To Safety – A Transition Year Programme



For 15-17-year olds

The Transition Year programme 'Your road to safety' is now available through the RSA's Virtual Learning Environment (VLE). This programme promotes awareness, knowledge, skills, values and aims to make the students safe road users.

This is a teacher-led programme and consists of 34 lessons to be delivered over the academic year. The programme focuses on preparing the students for learning to drive. The learning content is divided into four modules:

- Safe driver
- Safe journey
- Safe vehicle
- Developing road skills.

It focuses on behaviour that cause deaths on the roads – 'dangerous behaviours'. It shows students how we all share the road and have a personal responsibility to be safe road users. It covers:

- Seatbelts
- Speed
- Intoxicated driving alcohol and drugs
- Driver distraction
- Driver fatigue
- Passenger safety
- Vehicle maintenance.

We run educational campaigns for specific groups within the community based on their particular needs.

Virtual interactive presentations now available

Wrecked.ie

For adults aged 17-24

This programme targets young people who are a major risk group on Irish roads and are three times more likely to be killed in a collision than the rest of the population.

Wrecked.ie uses real-life stories to tell the consequences of road traffic collisions and other life-changing events that happen on our roads.

It features a series of vodcasts (video broadcasts) telling real-life stories of reckless road user behaviour. The vodcasts are illustrated with high-tech animation highlighting the key points in each speaker's testimony. These focus on themes such as driver distraction, drug driving, road user impairment, driving without insurance, modified cars and driving when using a mobile phone. This programme can also be given to students in SOLAS and Youthreach training programmes.

The accompanying guide tells you how to start a stimulating group discussion for each story where participants can talk openly about road safety.

We run free 'train the trainer' sessions on how to present this programme through our new Virtual Learning Environment (VLE).

Protecting our community

A call to action

This is a road safety awareness programme for adults based on the Rules of the Road. It consists of a resource pack and DVD. The programme aims to change the attitudes and behaviour of pedestrians, cyclists, motorcyclists and drivers.

Core topics covered include:

- Speed and speeding
- Road user impairment
- Unsafe behaviour towards or by vulnerable road users such as children, older adults, motorcyclists and cyclists
- Safety belts, child restraints and safety on buses
- Emergency services.

Topics are presented as thirty-minute 'session plans', ideal for community groups. They are highly interactive and include lots of activities.

We run free 'train the trainer' sessions on how to deliver this programme. These are aimed at people who work with community groups such as An Garda Síochána, youth workers and community leaders. You should have experience working with groups and have identified a group for this training.



CYCLE RIGHT

CYCLE RIGHT provides a defined standard of training in Ireland for both adults and children.

- Participants will be offered the skills to cycle confidently on the road network, from novice to competent cyclists.
- The programme will be delivered over three stages with participants gaining skills and knowledge on a phased basis, preparing them to cycle in increasingly complex road scenarios.
- All CYCLE RIGHT training is delivered by registered trainers.
- A new digital hazard perception resource has been added to the programme supported by the RSA, to help participants recognise and respond to hazards on the road.

Cycle Right ELearning Adult Training Resource

This ia a new support for adult cyclists in navigating traffic and the road system. It features a unique perspective on the road environment as seen from a cycling point of view.

The resource will bring cyclists through the essentials of being ready to cycle, cycling with others, positioning on the road, road structure, visibility and perception, and it will allow them then self-test their knowledge.

Structured in modules, the resource is designed to either be completed in sections and re-accessed or completed in one sitting.

'Check it Fits' Service

The RSA 'Check it Fits' Service is a free child car seat checking service. It aims to reassure parents, grandparents and guardians that their children are travelling safely in their child car seat and that the seat itself is securely fitted in the car. The service is available nationwide.

It was introduced in response to the frightening statistic that showed that as many as 4 out of 5 child car seats are incorrectly fitted. This can result in serious or fatal injury to a child in a collision. The service is quick, easy, and available throughout Ireland and can be offered virtually when required. Our experts will help you with any problem you have in installing your child seat. They will also show you how to fit the restraint correctly and answer any queries you may have.

In 1963 two physics researchers from the University College Dublin, Rev. Dr. Tom Burke and Dr. Tony Scott, came across the concept of 'Science Fairs' while conducting research in New Mexico. The pair decided tat this type of hands-on science was something that students in Ireland could benefit from. And so, the Young Scientist exhibition was born.

Director of Partnerships and External Affairs Sarah O'Connor with Sadbh Nolan, Kate Ballance and Alex McElroy from St. Mary's Secondary School, Dublin after winning this year's RSA Road Safety Award.

The title of their project was: 'Does music interfere with our Steering Wheels? A systematic investigation into the affects that different genres & styles of music have on driving ability nd driving habits.

"Arrive Alive at 1.5"

Wexford Native, Phil Skelton, whose cycling campaign, "Arrive Alive at 1.5", which inspired changes to the official Rules of the Road have been awarded the Road Safety Authority 'Gertie Shields Supreme Award' for 2022.

The award was presented to Mr Skelton by Minister of State for Transport Hildegarde Naughton at the RSA's Leading Lights in Road Safety' Awards in Croke Park.

Phil Skelton founded the "Arrive Alive at 1.5" campaign in 2013 following his own near miss of a close passing car. Phil advocated for greater driver education around a minimum passing distance for vehicles overtaking cyclists. As a result of Phil's campaigning, the Rules of the Road were updated to reflect a minimum passing distance of at least 1.5 metres for drivers travelling in speed zones over 50km/h, and at least

1metre in speed zones under 50km/h.



Checklist for hiring a bus

With child safety, everybody has a responsibility.

The statistics are surprising - during RSA and Garda school bus checkpoints last year, **one in two buses** were found have defects.

To ensure the safety of the children in your re, use the checklist on the back of this leaflet by time you hire school transport, photocopy the grand get the perator property in the perator of the pera

You can do your bit to make it safer outside school by:

- Driving safely and obeying the speed limits
- Parking so that your child can leave the car on the footpath side away from traffic
- Paying attention to other children at the side and behind your car when parking, dropping off or setting off
- Parking so you don't block the flow of traffic or access (don't double park) for emergency vehicles

Don't:

- Stop or park where there are yellow zig-zag lines along the edge of the road and the words 'SCHOOL KEEP CLEAR'
- Park on any double yellow lines
- Park on a footpath or a cycle track (this is an offence)
- Park in a way that would block the school entrance or exit, residents' driveways or junctions
- Park at bus stops, disabled parking spots or private parking spots
- Park within 15 metres before or 5 metres after a pedestrian crossing or traffic lights

Think about:

- Encouraging your children to walk or cycle to school to increase their physical fitness (it's a good opportunity for you to be more physically active too!)
- Car pooling or taking public transport
- Parking nearby and walking the rest of the way
